

# Frank Lloyd Wright's **STOCKMAN HOUSE**

Mason City, Iowa



**STYLE** The 1908 Stockman House designed by Frank Lloyd Wright is his only Prairie School house in Iowa open to the public. This middle-class house has the hallmarks of Wright's early Prairie School period (1900-1917).

**LOCATION** The Stockman House is near Wright's 1910 City National Bank & Hotel (restored as the Historic Park Inn Hotel). The nearby Rock Crest/Rock Glen houses designed by Walter Burley Griffin and other Wright associates is just south of the Stockman House (see map).

**TOURS** Stockman House tours are available at regularly scheduled times during the tour season and by appointment during the off season.

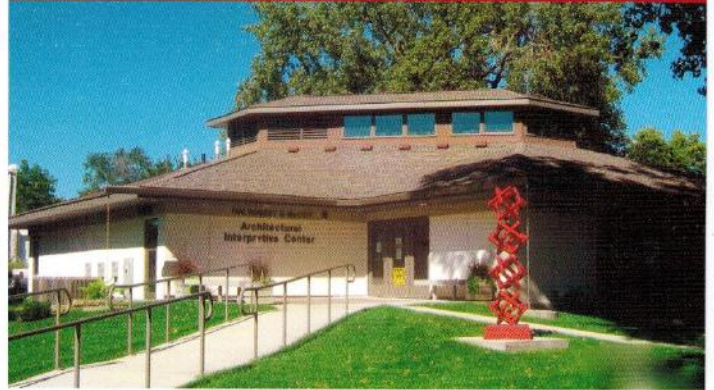

**ARCHITECTURAL INTERPRETIVE CENTER** Tours start at the AIC located adjacent to the Stockman House. Mason City's Prairie School architecture is interpreted through photos and architectural models. A gift shop located in the AIC features Frank Lloyd Wright inspired merchandise, books and items created by local artisans. Restrooms are also available.
